Introduction

The launching of the Clean-Up Mauritius and Embellishment Campaign 2017 by the Prime Minister, the Honourable Pravind Kumar Jugnauth on **05 March**, **2017**, was a landmark in the history of Mauritius. The Beach Authority has contributed positively by organising several activities on the same day in the four geographical coastal zones of Mauritius namely; in the North at Mont Choisy public beach, in the East at Belle Mare public beach, in the South at Le Bouchon public beach and in the West at Flic en Flac public beach. The Beach Authority called upon the collaboration of several stakeholders including the National Coast Guard, Mauritius Police Force, Ministries, NGOs and the public to keep our beaches cleaner, greener and safer.

Since the launching of the campaign, the Beach Authority has upgraded and embellished seventy-eight (78) public beaches as per its action plan, out of the total number of one hundred and twenty-six (126) proclaimed public beaches all-round the island.

The month of December 2017 was marked by several activities and projects listed hereunder, in connection with the Clean-Up Mauritius and Embellishment Campaign 2017.

1.0 Official Launching of the Recreational Park at St Felix public beach

The Recreational Park which was constructed at St Felix public beach in collaboration with the Beach Authority (BA), the Employees Welfare Fund (EWF) and the District Council of Savanne (DCS), was launched on the 10th of December, 2017 by the Honourable Fazila JEEWA-DAUREEAWOO, Vice-Prime Minister, Minister of Local Government and Outer Islands in the presence of the Honourable Etienne SINATAMBOU, Minister of Social Security, National Solidarity, and Environment and Sustainable Development, Mr. Dineshrao BABAJEE, Chairman of Employees Welfare Fund, Mr. Kamalsaw GAJADUR, Chairman of District Council of Savanne, Mr. Appalsamy Reddi SITANNAH, General Manager of Employees Welfare Fund and Dr. Dhuneeroy BISSESSUR, General Manager of Beach Authority. This venture will benefit all beach users, in particular, the inhabitants of the vicinity, namely Chemin Grenier, Chamouny, Rivière des Galets and Surinam amongst others.

1.2 Speeches

1.2.1 Address by Dr. Dhuneeroy BISSESSUR, General Manager of Beach Authority

The General Manager welcomed and thanked everybody for their presence and collaboration. During his speech, the General Manager stated that the mandate of the Beach Authority, as per the Beach Authority Act 2002, is to manage all proclaimed public beaches in Mauritius and Rodrigues islands. There are 126 proclaimed public beaches in Mauritius and 12 in Rodrigues making a total of 138 proclaimed public beaches under the jurisdiction of the Beach Authority. The ultimate aim of the Beach Authority is to embellish, upgrade and to provide better access to our public beaches for the benefit of the beach users.

The purpose of the event was to launch the Recreational Park at St. Felix public beach and for the first time such a project has been initiated with the collaboration of three institutions, namely, Employees Welfare Fund, District Council of Savanne and Beach Authority.

He also added that the following amenities have been completed:

- ➤ A jogging track of 1.5 km
- ➤ A beach soccer pitch of an area of 1000 m2
- ➤ A pétanque court of an area of 45 m2
- ➤ A footbridge to facilitate access to the jogging track
- ➤ Ramp to facilitate disabled persons to have access to the beach
- Wooden outdoor exercise equipment

The General Manager ended his speech by making an appeal to the public that the God gifted beach is our common area. Together let us preserve it, respect it, keep it clean and healthy for the benefit of the present and future generations.

10.0 Crack-down operations at Trou aux Biches, Mont Choisy, Grand Baie, La Cuvette and Pereybere public beaches

Crack-down operations were carried out at Trou aux Biches, Mont Choisy, Grand Baie, La Cuvette and Pereybere public beaches in collaboration with officers from the National Coast Guard, Mauritius Fire & Rescue Services, Mauritius Revenue Authority and Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Consumer Protection.

Contraventions established:

Five (5) contraventions were established for the following offences:

- (i) One (1) for 'Trading without Licence' at Grand Baie public beach
- (ii) Two (2) for 'Non Affixing of price labels on food items for sale' at Grand Baie public beach
- (iii) Two (2) for 'Use of domestic Liquified Petroleum Gas (LPG) for commercial purpose' at Pereybere public beach.


Way Forward
